

"Bear one another's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfil the law of Christ."

Galatians 6:2

Can you imagine what society would look like if we were bearing one another's burdens, or sharing one another's loads? At times you'll be helping me to carry my load, and at other times I'll be helping you to carry yours - so none of us is left to struggle on alone because we can rely on one another and love is clearly seen in action. This is what the Church is called to be but sadly we do not always get it right. As a result, people can feel abandoned, isolated and overwhelmed. It's good to know that God loves us, but often the best way to experience that love is through one another. Over the next few months many people of all ages will be struggling to make ends meet but there is support and help out there, so it is worth using an online benefit calculator, or speaking to someone at the Department for Works and Pensions or using an agency such as Citizens' Advice. 0300 330 9037; 10-4 Mon-Fri or

advice@citizensadvicenosn.org,uk to see if you are entitled to claim any benefits going.

Age UK has a campaign to get those who qualify onto Pension Credit. 4,000 people in Oxfordshire alone are missing out on this benefit. It may be that the credit of itself is worth very little, but the government uses this benefit as a trigger for other benefits (e.g., Housing benefit). Pension Credit is means tested but it has no capital limit. If you're a single person (over the age of 66) and have a weekly income of less that £182.60, or a couple (married or not, both over 66), with a weekly income less than £278.70, you may be eligible. It may take several months to process but anything awarded will be backdated to the application date, so it is worth exploring now.

Banbury Foodbank

We continue to support our local food bank. Suitable items can be left in the box provided in church or outside the vicarage (2 The Rydes, Bodicote) in the blue lidded box, although please use the collection points in the local supermarkets if you are able to. At the time of writing, they are particularly requesting tinned fruit, rice pudding and soup, long-life milk and jars of pasta sauce. All items should be several months in date! Please check their



website for current information and details of how to donate money or volunteer with them. https://banbury. foodbank.org.uk/

In order to access the services of the foodbank, you need a referral. Agencies they work with include: Citizens Advice, housing support officers, children's centres, health visitors, social services and some local charities. Banbury Breadline Project

Unlike the Foodbank, you do not need a referral or proof of benefits to access their services. The only criteria is that you are a Banbury resident, and they have confirmed that Bodicote residents are included in this, and in need of support from their surplus food redistribution.

On the Death of Queen Elizabeth II

At her coronation the Queen became the head of the Church of England. Seventy years later we are living in a very different world We are emerging as a new people from a pandemic, facing up to our responsibilities to the environment and living through yet another economic crisis. We are forever considering what our response should be and as a nation we often look to our monarch for comfort, guidance or reassurance. The Queen's Christian faith always had a profound influence on the way she lived her life. In 2002 she said;

"I know how much I rely on my faith to quide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God... I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel".

The Church is called to reflect God's character in the world. Faith in Christ must result in action. The Church, as The Oueen always attempted to do, must live lives consistent with the gospel as Christ's ambassadors. Therefore, we must present Christ as Saviour and as the One who cares for all humanity. We must show commitment to economic justice in society, look after our environment and have a caring attitude to others, 'love our neighbour as ourselves'. We must give practical help to the disadvantaged. We must not be overawed by the enormity of the crisis but strive to play our small part in whatever way we can. And as people of faith one of the most significant things we can do is pray, as the Queen said

"For Christians, as for all people of faith, reflections, meditation and prayer help us to renew ourselves in God's love, as we strive to become better people. The Christian message shows us that this is love for everyone. There is no one beyond its reach."

And so, we may wish to pray the final prayer printed in the Queen's personal Book of Devotions:

God be in my head, and in my understanding. God be in mine eyes, and in my looking. God be in my mouth, and in my speaking. God be in my heart, and in my thinking. God be at my end, and at my departing.

Bible Study Groups for Kingdom and Advent Seasons Following the success of the Bible study group for Creation season in September, which explored the topics of God's creation and the environment from a Christian perspective, we have decided to run another Bible study group throughout the Kingdom and Advent seasons of November and December, respectively. The Kingdom season celebrates Christ as King, whilst the season of Advent is a time of reflection and watchfulness, to prepare us for the coming of Christ at Christmas. Each study will be connected to the season it falls within and will be standalone, so that you can dip in and out of them easily as your schedule allows. Please note that this time, the groups will meet on a bi-weekly basis (every other week), on Thursday evenings at 7:30pm, starting on 3rd November and finishing on 15th December. As before, they'll be run as hybrid sessions, so you can either come in person or join on Zoom. If coming in person, we'll be meeting at Holly Tree Cottage (address below), or if you'd like the Zoom link, then please email me at the below address. I do hope you will find these Bible study groups interesting and enjoyable, and that they will help you get a better feel for the Church seasons, as well as helping to nurture and develop your faith. 
